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## Pennsylvania Ballet Presents Christopher Wheeldon's *Swan Lake*

### March 3-12 at the Academy of Music

Philadelphia, PA (February 11, 2011) –Pennsylvania Ballet brings the world's most famous ballet, *Swan Lake*, to the Academy of Music stage, March 3-12, 2011. Fred Alger Management is the presenting sponsor.

Premiered in 2004 to national acclaim, world-renowned choreographer Christopher Wheeldon's stellar production of *Swan Lake* was commissioned and performed to sold-out audiences for the Company's 40th anniversary season. This success led to an invitation to present the ballet at the prestigious Edinburgh International Festival in 2005, where Pennsylvania Ballet made its international debut. Tickets to this 2011 engagement are selling fast.

"*Swan Lake* is perhaps the most recognizable ballet in the world. Christopher's production beautifully pays homage to the ballet's great heritage while highlighting his own boundless creativity," Artistic Director Roy Kaiser says.

In a true case of art imitating life, dancers from Pennsylvania Ballet took their talents from stage to screen with their performance in the Academy Award-nominated film "Black Swan." Starring Natalie Portman and directed by Darren Aronofsky, the film is a dramatic thriller centered on a ballet company performing a new version of *Swan Lake*. Film fans now have the opportunity to see the dancers of "Black Swan" perform live.

Wheeldon's *Swan Lake* is based on the original Lev Ivanov and Marius Petipa classic from 1895 and set to the timeless Tchaikovsky score but has been re-imagined for today's audiences. Wheeldon compares this creative process to "resetting an old diamond heirloom into a contemporary setting." The million-dollar production features spectacular sets and costumes set in the 19th-century milieu of the Paris Opera Ballet of Edgar Degas.

Dazzling choreography and visual complexities illuminate ballet's greatest love story. *Swan Lake* tells of a young prince, Siegfried, and his love for the Swan Queen, Odette. Transformed into a swan by an evil sorcerer, Odette is destined to remain a swan unless she is rescued by true love.
