Due to his desire to return to the studio and share his knowledge, he created the Payne Academy of Ballet with his wife Bridget Payne where, for the past 17 years, the Academy has flourished and currently has 200 ballet students.

"Jim brings a breadth of experience from his professional career, years of developing dancers, and his success in building a school," said Shelly Power, Pennsylvania Ballet Executive Director. "We are eager for his arrival and are confident he will partner well with the community and continue the progress made by Assistant Artistic Director and Interim School Principal Samantha Dunster."

He will work to foster an environment that provides a healthy foundation in ballet for students looking for the highest caliber of dance education.
